

17 years ago, River & Sky began as a way for friends to hang out and hear amazing music together and connect with nature.

We are a grassroots, not-for-profit arts organization. This year marks our 17th festival! As a member-driven organization, we rely on the relentless energy and diverse talents of our volunteers to bring our festival to life.

Our vision

Our mission

To present regional, national and international emerging music while showcasing a community-based, simple, and sustainable way of life.

Recognizing the Land and the First Peoples

We recognize that we are operating on traditional Indigenous land within the Robinson Huron Treaty territory. We respect the cultures and peoples of the Atikameksheng Anishnawbek, Nipissing First Nation, Temagami First Nation, Wahnapitae First Nation, and Dokis First Nation. We recognize and respect the Aaniishinaabe peoples' sacred relationship with the land and water. River & Sky will continuously work to listen and learn from the shared wisdom of Indigenous peoples.

Accessibility + Audit

Checking in: If you have accessibility needs, please let us know at the gate or in the unloading area. We'll provide assistance in helping you to a campsite that is in a more accessible location.

During the festival: If you have mobility issues and need help getting to the Beach Stage or another area, please flag down a volunteer who can contact our roaming groudcrew to provide a ride. The gate staff are also always available with walkies to find you a ride.

Access In Excess Dan Ashworth, an accessibility agitator at heart, disability activist, musician, and a baker of buns, will be conducting an accessibility audit through Access In Excess. This project hopes to foster a more inclusive music culture, enabling more people with disabilities to experience the joy and community of music without facing barriers.

ANISHINAABE MURAL

River and Sky Music will host a powerful new community mural project that will unfold live during this year's festival, honouring Indigenous art, design, and storytelling through collaborative creation. This mural will not only be a beautiful outdoor piece of art, but also a living story inviting people to come together and learn from one another. Festival-goers will be invited to contribute to the mural throughout the weekend, working alongside local Indigenous artists to bring the design to life. The artwork will reflect local stories and symbolism in celebration.

Community voices will be collected throughout the process, so the River & Sky community can share their story through this community mural as co-creators of learning and arts. The mural will be overseen by Amanda Mathias, a local artist and educator residing in North Bay who is from Temagami First Nation. Amanda is deeply involved in community, arts, education, and social justice initiatives. She hopes this project will amplify the importance of protection for lands and waters.

Studio Nude Beach

BEASTIE BONES AND MORE – DANCE PORTAL AND BEACH STAGE

Studio Nude Beach is back, transforming the Dance Portal and Beach Stage into vibrant alien spaces. Look for their massive Beastie Bones, which made its inaugural appearance at Ice Follies in North Bay this year. The project invites an intermingling of fantasy and local ecologies, beckoning to the weird and alien within ourselves – a magical ecological space.

Studio Nude Beach is a mixed media arts collective based in North Bay. The collective's work has been featured at festivals and galleries alike - such as River & Sky, Kennedy Gallery, and Up Here. Their large scale installations have become a recognizable part of the arts and festival scene in Northeastern Ontario.

David Chops

THE JOY WITHIN – MAINSTAGE

David Chops' immersive art installation requires interaction to be fully appreciated. In The Joy Within, David explores colourful expression and the “internal kaleidoscope of colour that makes us what we are.” The piece also explores decommodification: “The profit over people world is happy to rob us of our joy, remake it ‘Now with 10% more colours!’ and sell it back to us hollowed out and empty. This art installation is a celebration of the rainbow of love in our hearts, the cultures we keep from being commodified, and reminds us that expressions of sadness and joy are not always what they seem. The spectrum of colour inside of us makes the human experience a beautiful thing.”

David is a self-taught artist based in the Boreal Forest of North-East Ontario. A survivor of poverty, child abuse, drug addiction, and homelessness, David found solace in underground social movements and a DIY ethos. As a climate change migrant, David has honed his skills and expanded his art, creating ambitious projects using non-traditional mediums. Learn more about him at purpleravenfarm.com

Allison Roberts

THE THRESHOLD IS THE PORTAL

Last year Allison Roberts, an emerging multidisciplinary artist based in North Bay, conceived of and launched into existence: “The Threshold Is The Portal,” an immersive alternate realm and experiment in the spell of collective experience. She is returning to bring back key elements of the Threshold experiment. Allison's work explores themes of alternate realities, connection, alchemy of space and distraction/focus pendulums. She is influenced by the lore and animism of the surrounding natural world.

The Oscillitarium

WALK TO THE LIGHT

Their performances are conjured in real time, utilizing slide film, painted glass, video feedback, VCR tragedies, and liquid manipulation through a cascading array of analog and digital projectors, culminating in mixed media buffets.



Through his farm and locally sourced ingredients, McTaggart Farms is living up to its motto: Real Food. Real People. Look for their specialty grill cheeses. McTaggart Farms is also catering all our volunteer and artist meals. Thank you Chris!

Q&A

Fireworks? No. Never. Ever. In fact, we will ask you to leave if you set them off. So please don't put us, or yourself, in that situation. They are not safe with so many people around.

Where do I get Ice? Ice can be purchased at the Merch tent, as well as the store located by the gate, called Lost & Sold – run by Chris Fisher, owner of Fishers' Paradise.

Firewood? Firewood is being sold this year as a fundraiser for River & Sky. It can be delivered to your campsite. Ask at the Merch tent.

Canoes? Canoes are available by the main stage, children must be accompanied by an adult. Don't forget to wear your lifejacket!

Lost & found? Anything you've found can be brought to the Merch tent or the Staff Cabin.

Minor Injuries or scares? R&S has a team of trained folks to ensure everyone's safety. Field First Response will be onsite with a range of supplies, a trailer, and a helpful hand for any minor medical mishaps. Besides that, there are simple first-aid kits available by each stage should you need anything super simple. Ask any R&S staff and they can direct you!

What if I need a hospital?

The closest emergency room is at the West Nipissing General Hospital, 725 Coursol Rd, Sturgeon Falls, ON. Turn right when you leave the property and follow the signs to Sturgeon – it is about a 25 minute drive.

What has “leaves of three” and you’re advised “to let it be”?

Poison ivy. Keep an eye out for this reactive weed and stick to the trails. There is a patch along the trail near Family Camping 2 that is marked with signage. Wash your skin with soap and a washcloth if you fear that you've brushed up against it. Getting rid of the oil will greatly reduce your chances of a reaction.



I am so thirsty... There is free drinking water available via a fill station near the Main Stage. Bring containers.

Yikes – Is that thunder and lightning? Follow the 30-30 rule. If there are 30 seconds or less between thunder and lightning take cover in a vehicle, building or low-lying area away from tall trees. Wait until 30 minutes after the last thunder before venturing out. Stay low but never lie down on the ground and keep both feet together to minimize ground current.

Can I start a fire? Fires need to be contained in fire pits. Wood will be provided in drop off areas. MNR fire bans apply to R&S. If you're planning on cooking, bring a propane stove. Be sure to have water standing by if you need to douse the fire in an emergency.

Be careful lighting your camp stove! Always read the instructions that come with your stove and be sure to keep away from the campfire and even full sunlight to prevent explosions. Always securely tighten the fuel tank cap and remove anything that might be flammable from the area. Remember to inspect any hoses or other pieces to prevent dangers from leaks.

Getting around at R&S: When walking, protect your feet. A flashlight helps in making your way to the late night campfire stage at the beach.

Bicycles: If you've brought your bike, enjoy! Remember to use your bell when navigating the pathways around pedestrians. If the bike doesn't belong to you – do not take it. Bikes are not communal property at the festival.

Where can I wash up? If you want to freshen up, go for a swim and sauna. Please use only biodegradable soap & shampoo with no phosphates in the river!

Can I swim and sauna? Go for it at your own risk and never under the influence! Note: Our beach area is unsupervised and the Sturgeon River has a current. You can also feel free to jump in the oxbow beside the main stage too. Children must be supervised by their parents in the water and sauna at all times.

What about smoking? Discretion is always appreciated, especially around children. Make sure your butts are well put out and disposed of properly in a tin can or your pocket. You can get a butt container for free at the Merch tent! Butts don't biodegrade and we want to keep Fishers' Paradise free of them.

Woof? Dogs are awesome but need to be on a leash. Please don't bring them directly in front of the main stage – it is a stressful place for dogs and a nice place for humans to sit on the grass.

Is this a BYOB festival? Yes! Open alcohol at your campsite is OK. If you are transporting from one campsite to another, please ensure containers remain closed and that alcohol is contained in a carrying device. And please, no glass, ever!

Where's the closest place to stock up? Turn left as you leave the property and 9 kms will take you to the LCBO in River Valley. Or turn right, and about 6 kms will take you to Field's LCBO in its generalstore. You can buy cake at the store too!

What do I do with my garbage? Look to sort your stash before you trash – recyclables, trash, and alcohol containers. Please don't hang onto your garbage until the end as it is no fun sorting at that point. Your empties go toward keeping R&S rolling.

Bullseye bite!? If you have a bulls-eye shaped bite or other strange rash from a bite get it checked out by a medical professional. Better yet, wear light coloured pants tucked into socks and long sleeves with DEET bug repellent to protect from ticks and other bugs. If bitten, never squeeze a tick, but pull out slowly near head with tweezers (saving it for identification). Slush area with rubbing alcohol.



Sauna etiquette: Make space for everyone on the benches. Stay hydrated and take breaks. Don't track mud into the sauna. No sleeping in the sauna. Use your indoor/sauna voice. Don't pour beer or other weird stuff on the fire. Call out/kick out creeps. Step up and be a pal if someone seems uncomfortable. Lack of clothes/semi-nudity isn't an invitation to anything. Do not get touchy in the sauna. Remember: no means no, maybe means no, drunk means no, high means no. Heck yes! means yes.

No sexism. No racism. No ableism. No ageism. No classism. No violence. No homophobia. No transphobia. No fatphobia. No hatefulness.
Close the dang door.

Let's stay safe and play safe!

Réseau ACCESS Network & Sanctuary

Réseau ACCESS Network is a non-profit, community-based charitable organization, committed to promoting wellness, harm and risk reduction and education. Réseau ACCESS Network supports individuals – and serves the whole community – in a comprehensive / holistic approach to HIV/AIDS, Hep C, Harm Reduction, and related health issues.

During River and Sky, Réseau staff will be available during the day at their tent to connect folks with harm reduction supplies, safer sex supplies, drug testing supplies and answer any related questions.

In the evenings they can be found walking around the festival giving out supplies/snacks/water, helping folks get back to their tents if they are lost, and just being available as support for people if they need some support.

Spot them with their fairy-light wrapped backpacks! Feel free to go over and say hello or grab a snack.

Naloxone Kits can be found at the First Aid tent and the Staff Cabin. We hope that these kits will not be used and that no one puts their life in danger. Morgan is an Anishinaabe Ojibwe Two-Spirit from Whitefish River First Nation living and working as an illustrator in Toronto. They are a multidisciplinary artist and instructor with over a decade of experience in the field with a penchant for the old, the retro and the anachronistic.

Learn more about Morgan's design:

"The original prompt for the work was 'Roots, Revival, Reset' and none of these things happen without water. I designed the background to frame the reflection of the moon in the water, which acts as the transforming body in bringing light into the root structure of the design.

It was also important to create a design that represents the historical context of the festival in addition to its future. I settled on a symbiotic relationship between something old and something new in the root structure.

The smooth rose, native to this area, represents the end of our festival's life-cycle. Blossoms are the fruit of living's labor, and the last celebration of its life before it winters ... The water runs swiftly, but when we connect to it, we are connected to all things together, always moving, always changing, always renewing."
